"There's a lot of expectations and it's easy for our young people to feel like they're just not enough. They want someone who can speak on their level authentically, who can see them not as a number, not as a grade point average, not as a statistic. The only one who can do that is Jesus Christ. It's so important to be able to talk to them and say, 'I see you. I see what you're going through. I'm being authentic with my own witness to you. And listen, this person, Jesus Christ, who sees you too, isn't asking you to be anyone other than who you are.' And the more that we can offer opportunities,

programs, encounters, experiences where they hear that message in a way that resonates with their personal experience, that's what it's going to take to pass that faith on to the next generation."



The ministry provides education and awareness; creates a welcoming, accepting environment; offers companionship for those affected by mental health issues; supports family members and caregivers; and provides advocacy and referrals for therapy, counseling, or clinical treatment.




